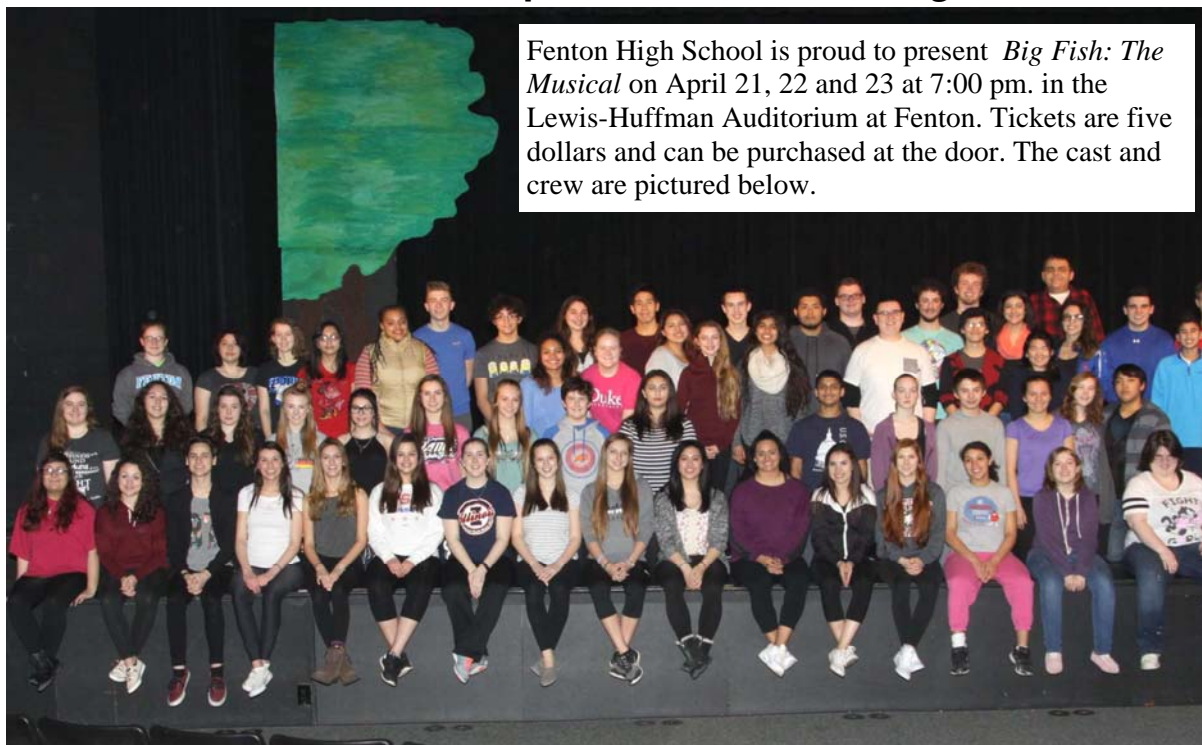


Fenton Drama Department Presents *Big Fish*

Fenton Community High School District 100 Pest Control Notification

The Illinois legislature passed amendments to the Structural Pest Control Act and the Illinois Pesticide Act that affects how pests, mice, ants, etc., are controlled in schools. The legislation affects school in two ways. 1) All Illinois schools are required to adopt a pest control process called Integrated Pest Management or IPM, and schools are required to notify staff, students and parents prior to certain types of pest control applications.

Integrated Pest Management places emphasis on inspection and communication with the school administration. The focus of the program is to identify and eliminate conditions in the school which could cause pests to be a problem. Applications of pest control materials are made only when necessary to eliminate a pest problem. Regular spraying is not a part of the program.

If it becomes necessary to use any pest control products other than traps or baits, notice will be posted two business days prior to the application. The *only* exception to the two day notice would be if there is an immediate threat to health or property. If you would like to receive written notification prior to the application of any pest control materials subject to the notification requirements, please contact Blake Brodie, Director of Buildings and Grounds at 630-860-6275. The school district has contracted with Big Foot to provide Integrated Pest Management services. If you have any questions about the information and procedures, you may contact Big Foot at 310 E. Did you know that Mr. Becker, Mr. Castro, Mr. Koranda and Mrs. Pomahac were former Social Studies, English, ESL and Special Education teachers respectively? They bring these rich teaching experiences to our classrooms. In addition to their school responsibilities, our assistant principals are instructional leaders in our school. They conduct teacher evaluations, lead student academic and social/emotional interventions, and they are the first line of contact with our parents and community members. Most importantly, our assistant principals support and love our students everyday. They build productive and positive relationships with every student they encounter.

Our assistant principals are the glue and the backbone of our school. Their responsibilities are endless and complicated. They help our school run smoothly every single day and every single year. I encourage all the readers to send an email or note to our assistant principals, and tell them how wonderful they are.

THANK YOU Mr. Becker, Mr. Castro, Mr. Koranda and Mrs. Pomahac for all of your hard work! Thank you for greeting our students in the morning, and when they go home in the afternoon. Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) Parent Connection

During the month of April, Fenton's SEL program will focus on the Illinois State Standard of applying decision-making skills to deal responsibly with daily academic and social situations. Students received an organizational chart in their Google Drive SEL folder to record their current class grades and set goals for what grades they would realistically like to achieve by the end of the semester. According to research, this type of activity helps students in the following ways (Hellriegel, Slocum, and Woodman & Martens, 1992 & 1987):



- Goals guide and direct students' behavior.
- Goals provide clarity for students.
- Goals help improve performance.
- Goals increase the motivation to achieve.
- Goals improve self-confidence.
- Goals help decrease negative attitudes.
